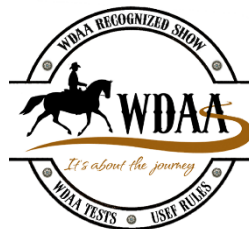

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Competition Rules: To be eligible to participate and/or compete as an exhibitor, owner, lessee, agent, coach, or trainer in any Western Dressage class at any Federation-Licensed Western Dressage Competition, persons must be active members of WDAA or pay a non-member fee equal to the price of an annual membership for each competition." Proof of WDAA membership must be made available to Competition Management at a competition. If an individual is unable to present proof of membership, he/she must complete and sign a show pass form and pay a show pass fee of \$45 (adults) or \$30 (Juniors as defined in USEF Rule GR128). USEF show passes must be obtained on their website directly by the competitor at: <https://www.usef.org/show-pass>

Amateur Status: If you are entering amateur classes, you will need to provide proof of amateur status with your entry. If you do not provide proof of amateur status, you will be placed in the open division. Because this is a USEF recognized show, the only acceptable proof of amateur status is a USEF Amateur card. Please see <http://www.usef.org> for more information on obtaining an amateur card.

Junior Status: Riders are eligible to compete as juniors if they are 17 years of age or less at the beginning of the 2023 competition year (December 1, 2022 – November 30, 2023).

ALL PAPERWORK, INCLUDING ENTRY, COGGINS, USEF/WDAA DOCUMENTS, ETC, MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE ALONG WITH YOUR ENTRY ON EQUESTRIANENTRIES.COM HARD COPY PAPERS ABSOLUTELY WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

All entries must include proof of negative Coggins test within 12 months of show date, and USEF and WDAA documents for rider, owner, trainer and horse as appropriate for entry/classes.

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CONDITIONS OF ENTRY: Every horse and pony entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but the show management will, in no case, be responsible for loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of each entry that each exhibitor should hold the horse show, the officials, the show employees, the show facility, it's directors, and employees, USEF, it's directors and employees harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horse or equipment which may occur from accident, sickness, fire, or otherwise. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide classes, or to change officials as it deems necessary. Decision of Show Management is final. Failure to enter the ring by scheduled time may incur elimination. This is the responsibility of exhibitor. Score sheets will only be given to riders of their authorized representatives after results have been posted.

ENTRY CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS: Office fee is not refundable. Entries with cancellation on or before the closing date will receive 100% refund of all fees minus the office fee. NO REFUNDS (including stabling) after original Closing Date even if Closing date is extended. Management will not refund entries for shows cancelled due to severe weather, acts of God, or other such emergencies.

FARRIER: Information will be provided and posted in the show office

VETERINARIAN: On call – names and numbers to be posted at the office & in the show program.

SCHEDULE: Will be emailed out to the competitors and posted on social media by noon the day prior to the first day of the show.

STABLING: All stalls will be assigned, limited availability on a first come first serve basis. Stall do not need to be stripped, just cleaned. Initial one (1) bag of bedding provided. Outside shavings not allowed. Additional shavings can be purchased at the time of entry. Stall doors will be provided.

SHARPS CONTAINER: Available in the show office for disposal of any needles. Competition management may fine any individual including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

WE ARE ONLY ACCEPTING ONLINE ENTRIES ONLY AT EQUESTRIAN ENTRIES LINK. YOU MUST PAY BY CARD WHEN YOU ENTER. CHECKS AND CASH WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. Late/post entries accepted if schedule permits. Entry fees and stall assignments are non-transferable and non-refundable after the closing date for any reason, including "acts of God" which require management to cancel classes or day(s) of competition. Management may refuse any entry whose account is not in good standing by the start of the competition.

Late Entries: All entries must be postmarked on or before the closing date. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of management and will incur a late fee of \$50.

ADULT AMATEURS PLEASE NOTE THAT IN ORDER TO HAVE YOUR SCORES RECORDED WITH USEF FOR USEF AWARDS YOU MUST BE A RECORDED ACTIVE AMATEUR WITH USEF & SUPPLY YOUR NUMBER WITH YOUR ENTRY

NO REFUNDS after the closing date (**GR 311.1.7** exception "act of God" in which classes are canceled only those class fees will be refunded). Refunds before closing date will be issued for amount paid minus the office fee. Returned Checks will incur a \$50 return fee, if not rectified within 10 days the matter will be turned over to USEF for disciplinary action.

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AWARDS: Ribbons will be awarded first to sixth place. Intro through Level 5 tests will be split AA, Open, Gaited and Youth *if entries warrant*. No awards will be mailed unless arrangements are made in advance through the Secretary.

FREESTYLES: Riders, please submit music on a CD to the announcer's booth the morning of your ride. Music should be labeled with instructions and horse/rider names. Sound checks will be available.

RIDE TIMES: Ride times will be emailed to all competitors upon completion. All ride times are to be considered tentative until noon the day before the show day. Please check your ride times outside the office on the results board, for up-to date times.

ATTIRE AND EQUIPMENT: USEF rules and guidelines will be used for attire and equipment. For more information please review the USEF rule WD 120 121 122 123 by clicking this link <https://www.usef.org/forms-pubs/NpmAWxkXY6M/wd-western-dressage>.

SAFE SPORT STATEMENT: Effective immediately, any competition with the start date of September 1, 2020 and later will be required to include the following Safe Sport statement in the Rules and Regulation section of the prize list: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

ARENA INFORMATION: Covered arena with sand, mixed footing. All intro and basic classes will be in a small ring 20x40. All other classes will be in a 20x60.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

PERSONAL ELECTRONIC TRANSPORT DEVICES: The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

EQUINE VACCINATION RULE: At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering

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the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within 6 months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.

DRUG TESTING: All exhibitors are required to pay the USEF Drug & Medication fee of \$23 and are subject to being randomly drug tested at the competition. (For USEF shows only)

DIRECTIONS: From I-75 North, take Exit 220 to State Road 64 E. Stay on SR 64 E for 12 miles. Turn right on CR 675 (Waterbury Road). In 1 mile turn right into SMART.

From I-75 South, take Exit 217 to FL-70 E. Stay on FL-70 E for 14 miles. Turn left on CR 675 (Waterbury Road). In 4 miles turn left into SMART.

DOGS: No dogs are allowed on the show grounds.

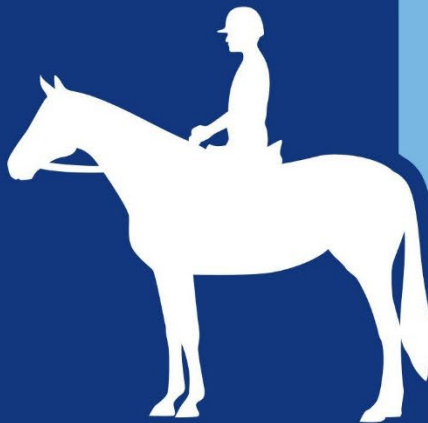
A Horse/Rider combination may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. Suitability, Hack and Equitation are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition. No horse may be ridden more than once in any Western Dressage class (including separate divisions or sections of the same class number). Horses cannot be ridden by more than two riders. Rides will be limited to 4 tests per horse, excluding suitability, equitation, and hack. If there is a conflict with breed division rules regarding WD102.2, the breed division rules will govern United States Equestrian Federation rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the showgrounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire. Exhibitors should also be aware of the USEF rules governing drugs and medications. NUMBERS: must be worn at all times while a horse is out of their stall.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

WARNING:

Under Florida law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("**Liability**") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.
